Since its inception, the Pengrowth-Nova Scotia Energy Scholarship Program has provided financial assistance to more than 180 students. These students have been well-rounded individuals with a variety of interests including community activities like volunteer work, sports and other extra-curricular activities. To be considered for the scholarship, students are expected to have similar experiences along with a demonstrated interest in Energy as indicated in their **personal essay**, which is to be included with the application package.

University Scholarship

Eligibility requirements:

- Must be accepted into an accredited post-secondary educational institution for studies in business, science or engineering at the bachelor level
- Must be graduating from a Nova Scotia secondary school with a full academic course load in the final year (Grade 12) with an average mark of 75 per cent or higher
- Must not be receiving other scholarship support exceeding \$2,500
- Must be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant and a permanent resident of Nova Scotia One scholarship is designated to a visible minority*

To apply

Applications can be downloaded from the Nova Scotia Department of Energy website. Student candidates must be nominated by a guidance counselor. Completed applications can be submitted to the Department of Energy for final review by an awards committee. Please see energy.novascotia.ca/career-development/scholarship-program for more details.

Nova Scotia Community College Scholarship

Eligibility requirements:

- Must be accepted into the Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) for full-time studies in an eligible trade or technology program. View a full list of eligible programs on the application form
- Must have graduated with a high school diploma
- Must be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant and a permanent resident of Nova Scotia

One scholarship is designated to an Aboriginal student*

Mature students pursuing a designated NSCC energy-related program may apply for this scholarship.
