The Energy Training Program helps post-secondary students and recent graduates get work experience in the energy sector with a hiring incentive for local businesses. Employers receive 60% (up to \$12.00 an hour) of the student or graduate's wages for a 12 to 17-week work term.

The 2025 funding period is from April 21 to August 29. Employers can hire co-op students, non co-op students and recent graduates. All students and recent graduates must start their work terms by June 9, 2025. For co-op students, please consult the specific university's requirements and conditions.

Eligibility Overview

Employers

- Students who self identify as Mi'kmaq or Indigenous, African Nova Scotians, Visible minorities,women in under represented roles as well as persons with disabilities will be eligible for a 60% subsidy during the program period.
- Must outline a direct connection to the energy sector in Nova Scotia.
- Must provide their Canada Revenue Agency number and registration number Companies Act.
- Preference will be given to Nova Scotia small (max. 100employees) to medium(max. 500 employees) size enterprises ("SME"). Larger local firms and non profits may be considered as funding levels allow.
- Must provide work term experience directly related to the student's program of study.
- Employer must be in good financial standing with the Government of Nova Scotia.

Employees

- Must be a current post-secondary student or have graduated from a recognized Nova Scotia post-secondary institution within 18 months of the first day of the work term.
- Must have the appropriate work permit for employment within the province if necessary.
- Must self identify on Student information form to be eligible for increased subsidy from 50%-60%
- Must not be immediate family of the business owner, the project contact or senior administrative staff of the company. *Immediate* family includes child, stepchild, ward, spouse, common-law spouse, parent, sister, brother, grandparent, grandchild, aunt, uncle, niece and nephew.

Overview of Terms and Conditions

- Employers must pay at least the legal minimum wage plus 4% vacation pay. The employer is responsible for paying Employment Insurance, Canada Pension premiums and Workers' Compensation coverage.
- Employers must provide appropriate workplace safety training commensurate with student job tasks.
- Positions must be related to the student's field of study.
- The employee must not displace any existing staff.
- Employers must not receive wage funding from other government sources for the intended position during the specified funding period.
