

2020 | *Pengrowth–Nova Scotia* ENERGY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Nova Scotia is developing a world-class energy sector. Offshore oil and gas, a growing renewable energy industry, excellent professional and technical education and training programs – they all come together here in Nova Scotia, leading to great prospects for rewarding, well-paid careers.

The Pengrowth-Nova Scotia Energy Scholarship Program can help you achieve success when you choose to develop the knowledge and skills needed to work or conduct research in this exciting field. Eight scholarships valued at \$10,000 (\$2,500 renewable over four years), are awarded annually to students completing grade 12 at Nova Scotia high schools with the intent to pursue energy-related studies at university.

Pengrowth-Nova Scotia Energy Scholars are well-rounded individuals with a variety of interests who have an established track record of community involvement through activities like volunteer work, sports and other community-based activities.

Eligibility requirements:

- Must be accepted into an accredited post-secondary educational institution for studies in business, science or engineering at the bachelor level
- Must be graduating from a Nova Scotia secondary school with an average mark of 75 per cent or B in your final year (Grade 12)
- Must not be receiving other scholarship support exceeding \$2,500 in your first year of studies
- Must be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant and a permanent resident of Nova Scotia
- Must be prepared to demonstrate interest in an energy-related career through an essay included in the application

Guidance nomination

Nomination from a guidance counsellor, as outlined in Part E, is required for this scholarship. Each school can nominate one student for every 100 students graduating. For example, if 200 students from your school are graduating, two students can be nominated.
